



Longwick Enrichment Opportunities

Whole-school curriculum enrichment gives our children the chance to explore themes and subjects in greater depth, extending their learning beyond everyday lessons. These experiences help them to develop additional skills, immerse themselves in creative challenges and understand how learning connects to the wider world. Enrichment places the curriculum in context, making learning memorable, meaningful and rooted in real-life application. Enrichment is in addition to our regular curriculum offer.

Children may work alongside those from other classes and year groups, strengthening social confidence, collaboration and communication — key life skills that support them as they move from **growing** to **flourishing** and ultimately **flying**. Enrichment activities take many forms:

- class visits within and beyond the local community
- visitors to school from the community and beyond
- farm and forest school
- outdoor learning opportunities
- whole-school writing events
- themed curriculum days
- church-linked experiences
- 'Love to Learn' sessions
- creative home-learning opportunities

These activities deepen understanding, celebrate creativity and reinforce our strong partnership with families, the church and the wider community.

Enrichment days and events may vary each term depending on availability, age of children, seasons and opportunities. Our aim is to ensure that every child experiences a broad and exciting range of activities during their time with us, helping them build confidence, curiosity and a love of learning.

A calendar of enrichment opportunities will be sent to parents at the beginning of each half term.
